

Code of Conduct for Junior Members

All Junior Members of Sandy Cricket Club will be expected to abide by the following code of conduct:

- All members will be expected, at all times, to show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others.
- All members must respect the rights and beliefs of all other participants regardless of ability, religious/cultural background, or gender.
- Members should inform their coaches & managers promptly if they are going to be late for any training session or match.
- All junior members must play within the rules of the game, and must respect all officials and their decisions.
- Members should pay all training and match fees promptly, or inform their coach/manager if unable to do so.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises, or whilst representing the club at any event/competition.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises, or whilst representing the club at any event/competition.
- Junior members must not use abusive language at any time whilst on the club premises, or whilst representing the club at any event/competition.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs or use abusive language at any time on club premises, or whilst representing the club at any event/competition.
- Members must wear suitable kit (e.g. cricket whites or tracksuit and trainers) for training sessions and matches, as agreed with their coach/manager.

Sandy Cricket Club also encourages junior members to be open at all times, and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with the club's Child Welfare Officer (Peter Gurney) or their coaches & manager.
